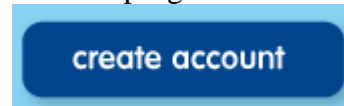

NOTE: You may create a maximum of 5 Popplets.



Creating an Account

At the top right of the screen, click the **Create Account** button.



Fill in the required information. Be sure to click the **I Agree** box. Then click **Next**.



To log in to an existing Popplet account, click the **Log In** button at the top right of the screen.



Starting a New Popplet

Click the **Make New Popplet** button.

make new popplet

Name the file, and select a background color. Then click the **Make It So** button.

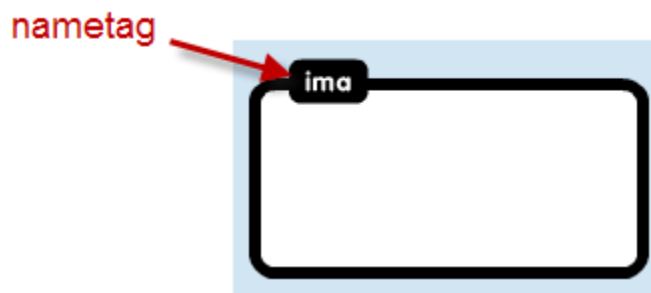


A tutorial will appear on the screen. You can page through it by clicking the **Next** button, or close it by clicking the **X**.

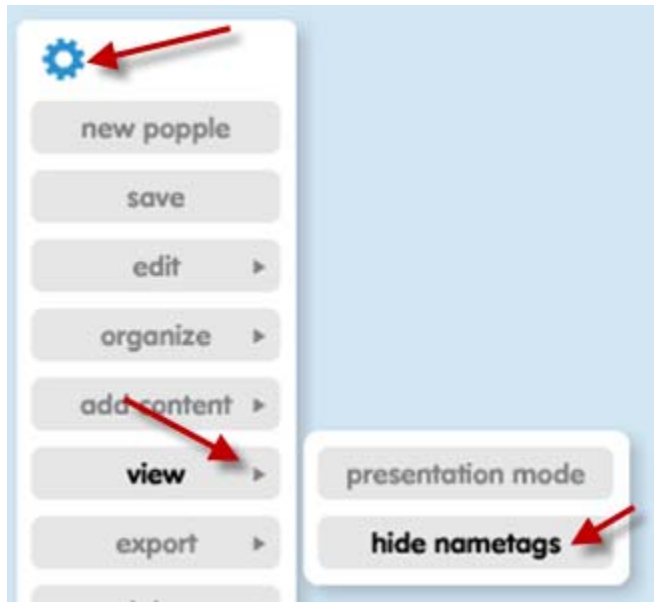


Double click anywhere on the screen to create the first “popple.”

By default, every popple will display your name.

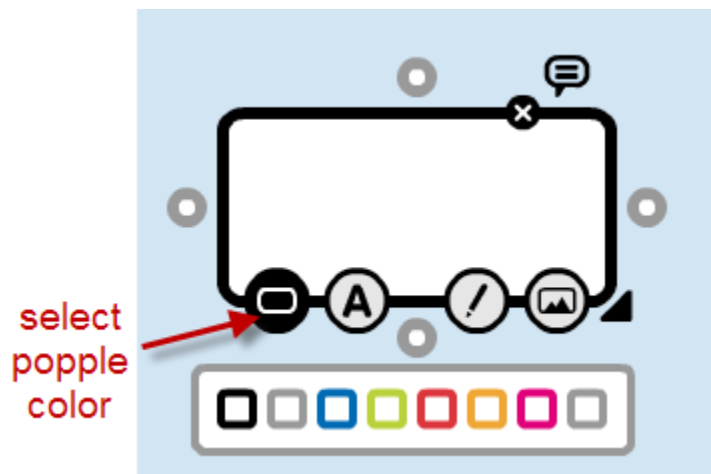


To hide all nametags, choose the **Gear Menu > View > Hide Nametags**.

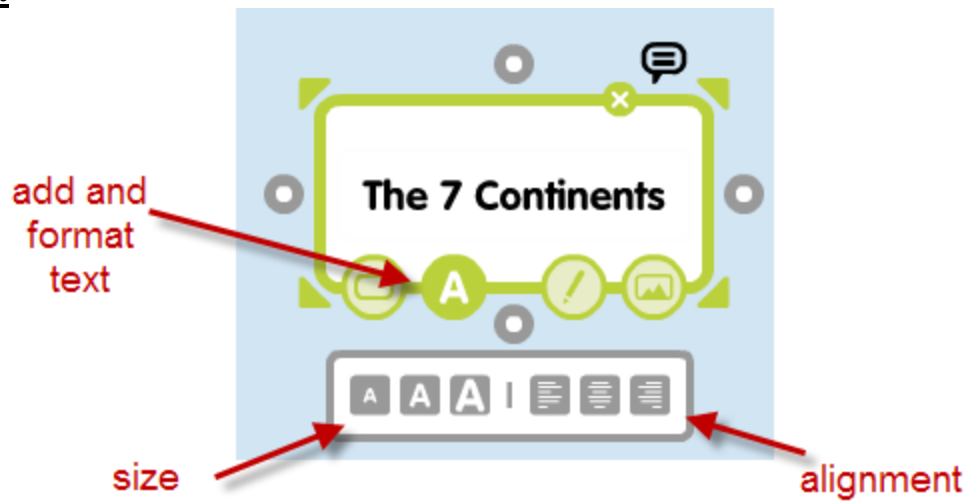

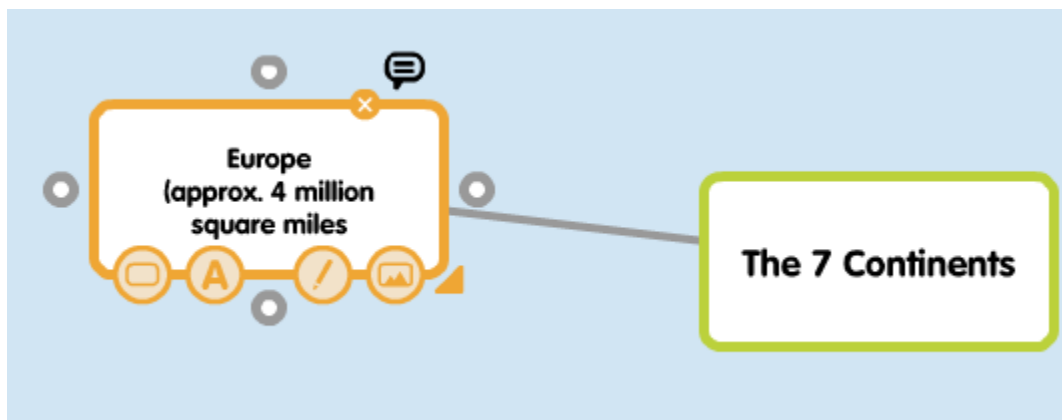

To use an image in Popplet, it must first be saved somewhere on your computer.



Move Popples

Click/ hold/drag on the popple's border to move it.

click/hold/drag to move



To move the entire Popplet, click/hold/drag on an open area on the screen.

You can also use the Zoom tool to change the Popplet view.



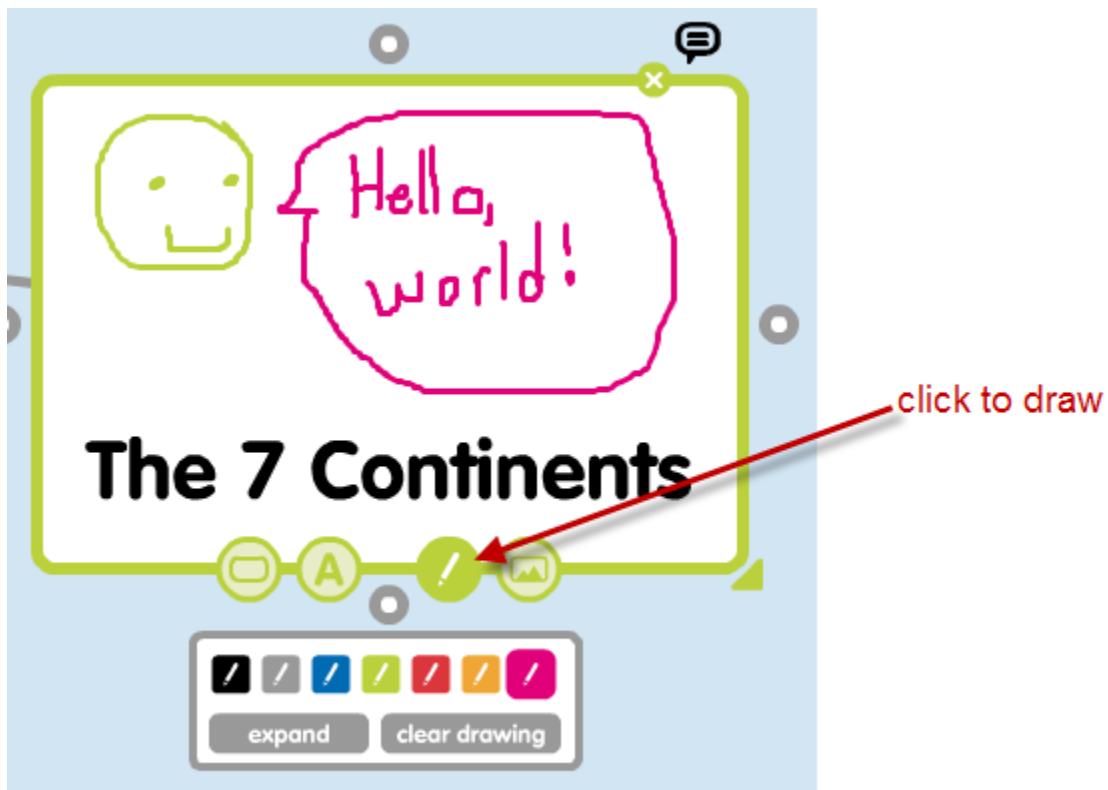
Resize a Popple

Click/hold/drag on the arrow to resize popple. The popple and the image will resize, but not the text.



Drawing Tool

Choose the drawing tool, then select a color.

Comments

Comments can be used in collaboration with other Popplet users, or as a way to add more information without adding more popples to the screen. In the sample, I used comments to add facts about the continent without adding additional popples to the screen.

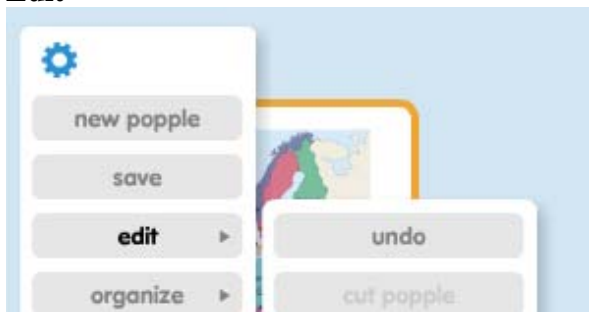

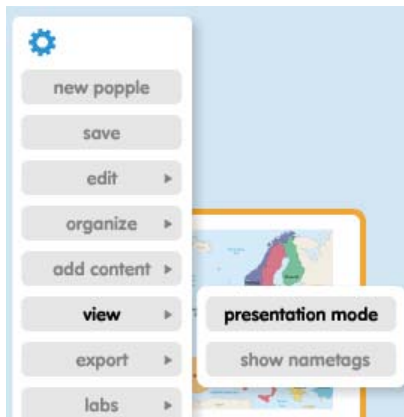

Organize – alignment of popples



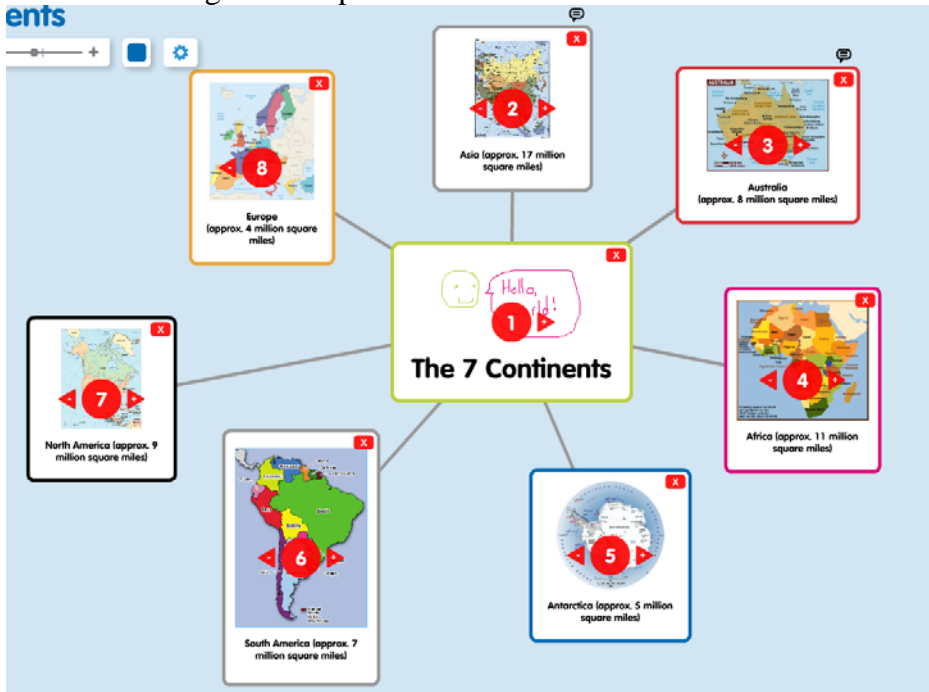
View – presentation mode. Presentation Mode creates a slideshow that you can page through using the arrow keys on your keyboard.



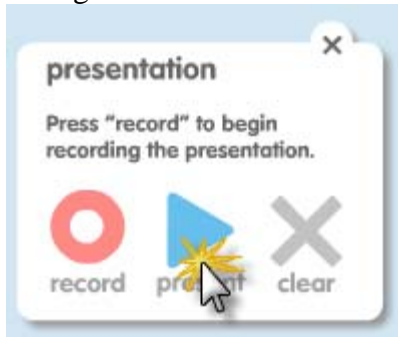
Click **Record**, then click on each popple in the order in which you would like to view it.



Click **Record** again to stop.



Click **Present** to view the show. Press the right and left arrow keys on your keyboard to navigate through the show.



Click **Exit** to return to regular mode/

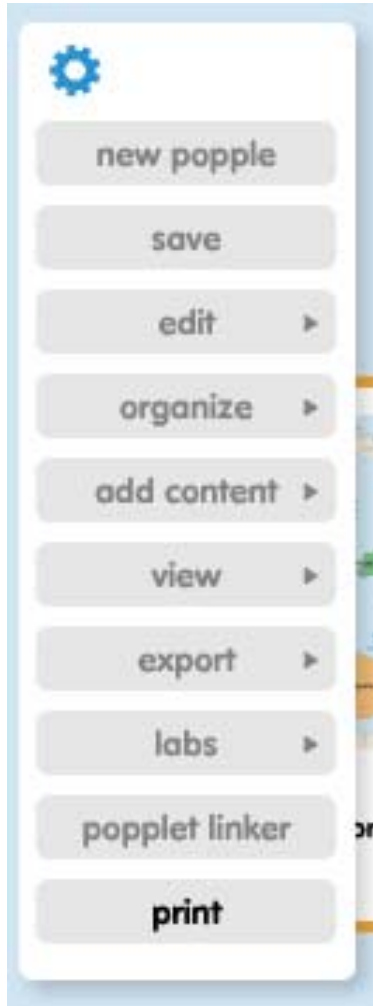


Export

You can save a popplet as a pdf or jpg image file. Comments are not viewable in the exported file. The popplet is not editable in the exported view.



Print – Comments are not viewable in the printed file.

Click the **Home** button.

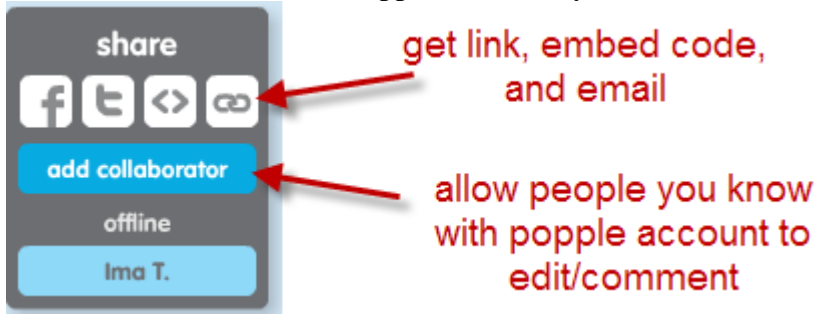


Sharing a Popplet

Click the **Share** button at the top right of the screen.

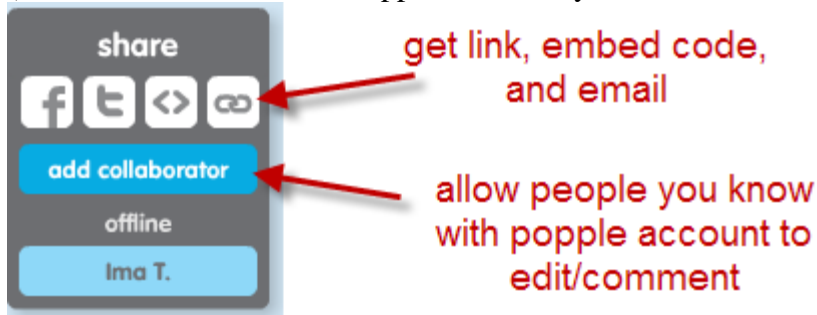
Embedding a Popplet on Your SchoolWires Website
