The interest levels listed in this bibliography are those given by the publishers. Each teacher, however, needs to decide the age suitability for their own students.

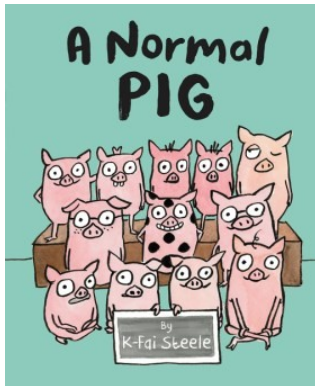

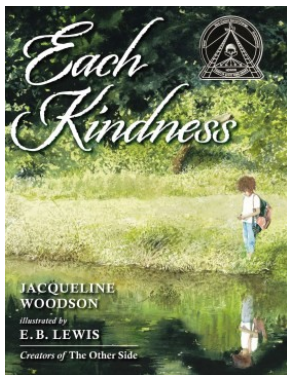
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Picture Book Format

by Jacqueline Woodson, c2012 (IL: K-3, RL: 3.1)

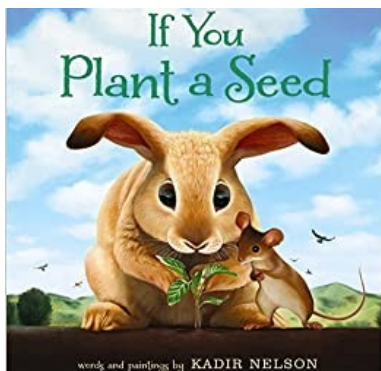

If You Plant a Seed

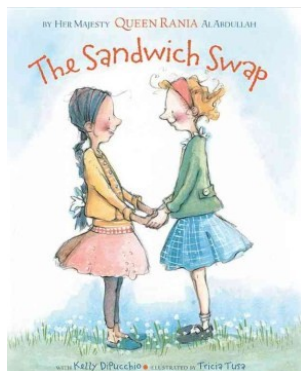

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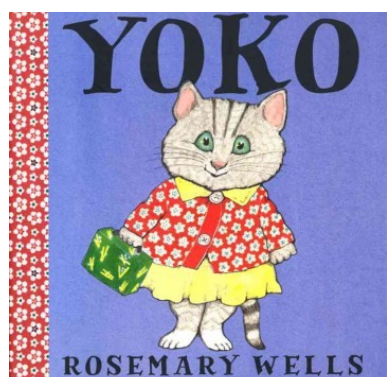
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The Sandwich Swap

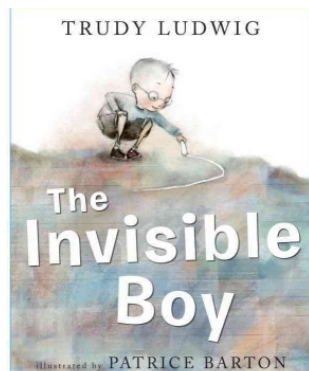

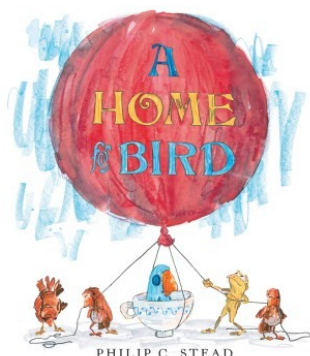
The Invisible Boy

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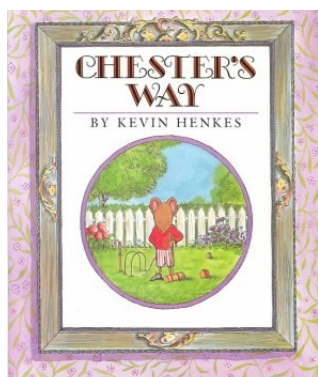
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A Home for Bird

by Philip C. Stead, c2012 (IL: K-3, RL: 2.1)

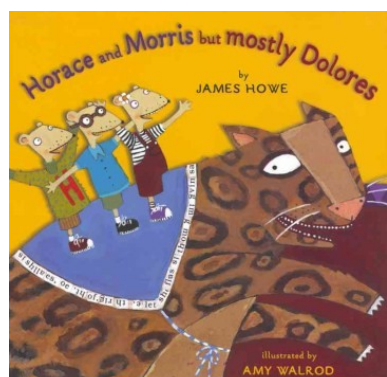

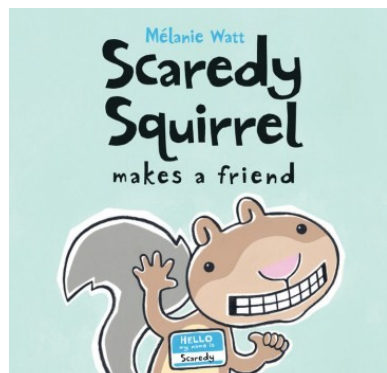

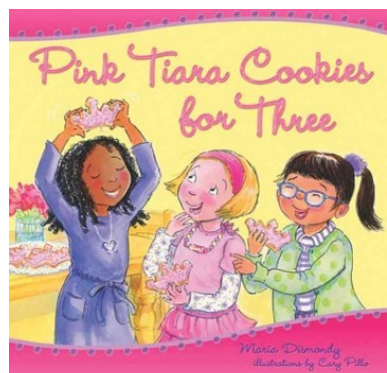
Scaredy Squirrel Makes a Friend

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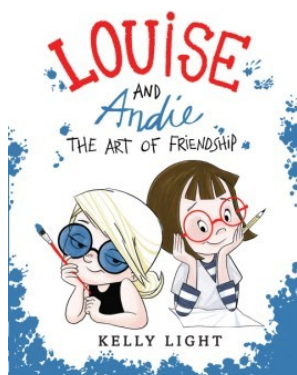

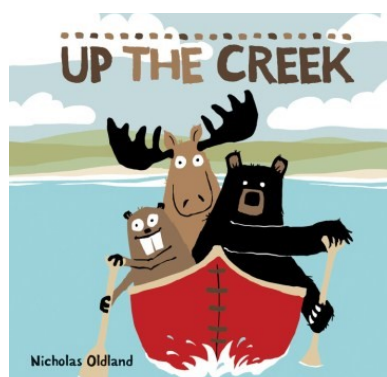

"A bear, a moose, and a beaver, who are best friends but often disagree, have a trying adventure when they decide to take a canoe trip together." - Follett



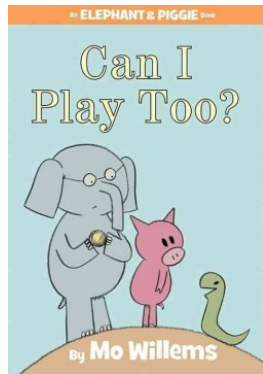
Big Friends

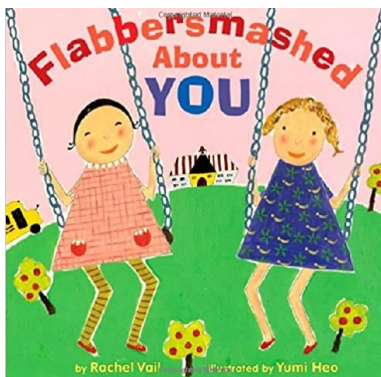
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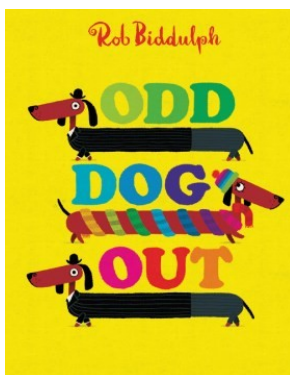
Can I Play Too? (Series: Elephant and Piggie) by Mo Willems, c2010 (IL: K-3, RL: 0.6)

"In *Can I Play Too?* Gerald and Piggie meet a new snake friend who wants to join in a game of catch. But don't you need arms to catch?" - Pub.



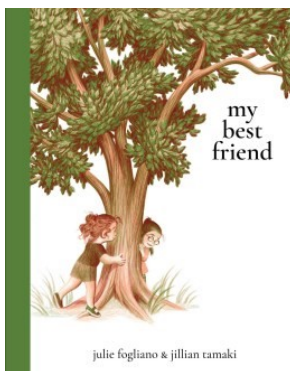
Flabbersmashed About You by Rachel Vail, c2012

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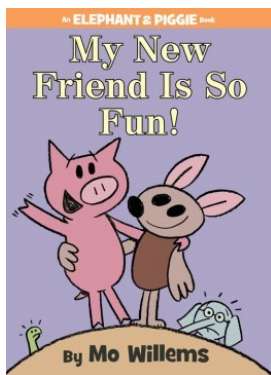
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The Buddy Bench

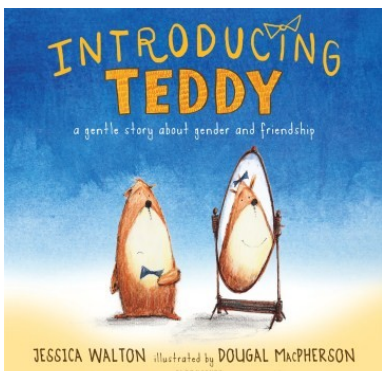

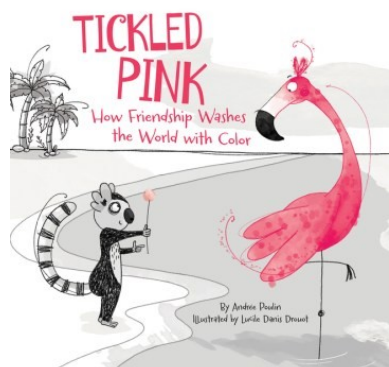
Introducing Teddy: A Gentle Story About Gender and Friendship

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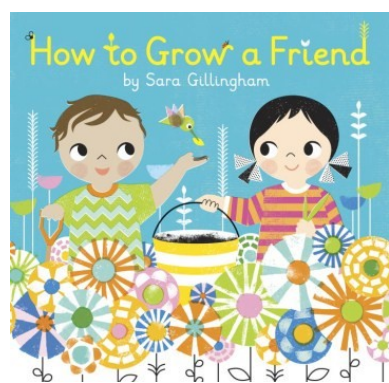
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Tickled Pink

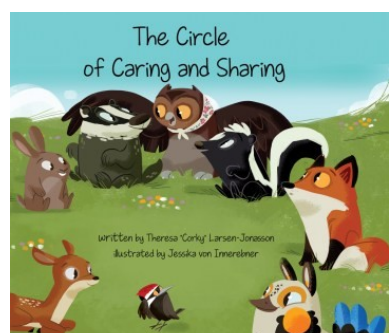

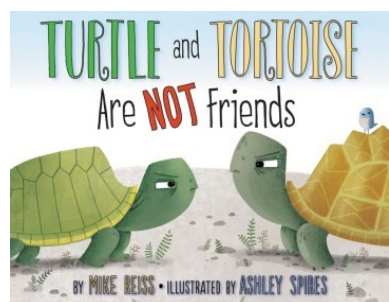

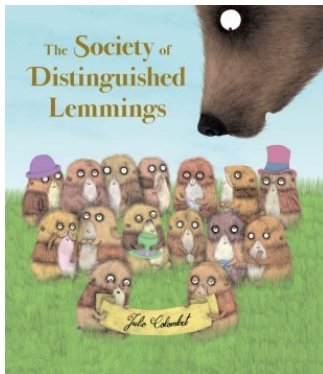
Turtle and Tortoise are NOT Friends

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The Society of Distinguished Lemmings by Julie Colombet, c2020 (IL: K-3, RL: 3.0)

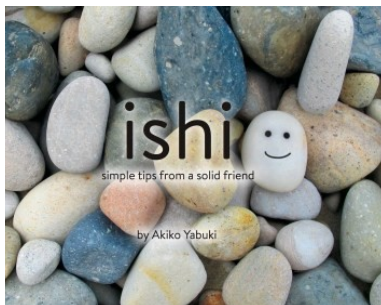

The Recess Queen

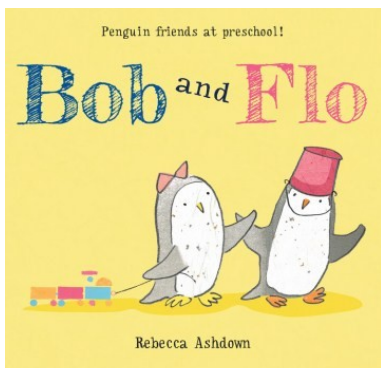
