# Distance Learning with a student who is Deaf/Hard of Hearing

Some tips compiled to make it easier for Deaf/HH students to learn virtually.

## Use a microphone or headset

if available, this can make It easier for the student to hear you clearly.



## Light should be facing you, not behind you.

Posterior lighting darkens the face and makes it more difficult to get visual cues.



#### Mute all students.

This makes It clear to follow who Is speaking.



#### Determine a procedure for asking questions.

For example, typing Q in the chat box to indicate the child has a question.

### Use Closed Captioning on all Visual Media

Students should know to turn on closed captioning on videos that they would watch during their independent learning time.



#### Reduce background noise.

Please turn off any background noise in your space (ex. Fan, TV, dishwasher).



# Check for understanding in open-ended questions.

Avoid yes/no questions.

State the name of the student being called on, and repeat what was said.

Repeat what the student shared in case it was not audible for the child with a hearing loss.
