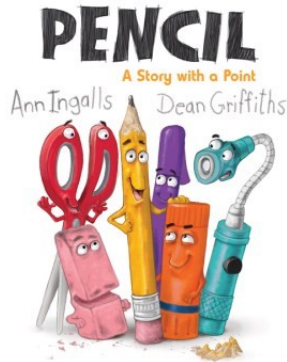


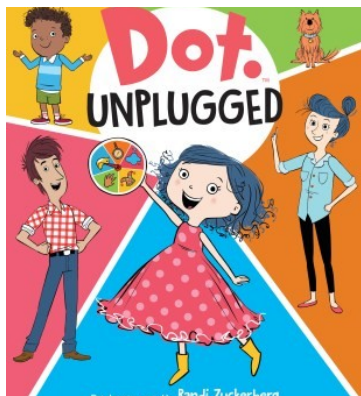
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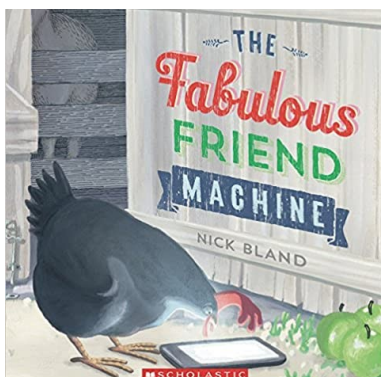
Pencil: A Story with a Point

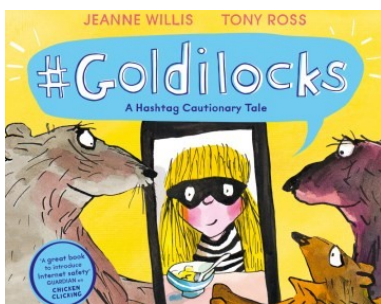
Dot: Unplugged

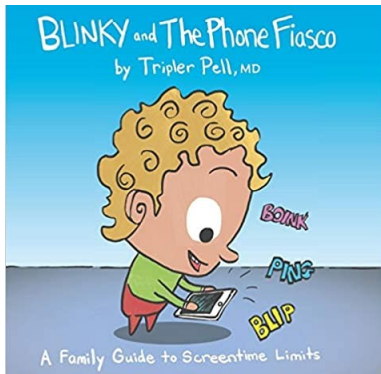


#Goldilocks: A Hashtag Cautionary Tale

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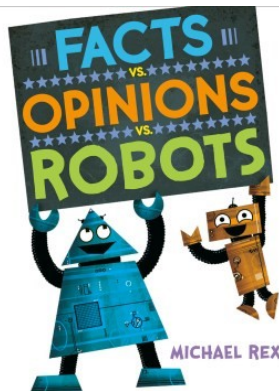
Blinky and the Phone Fiasco by Tripler Pell, MD, c2016

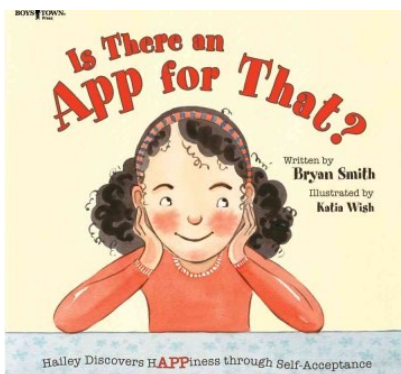
The Sad Little Fact by Jonah Winter, c2019 (IL: K-3)
