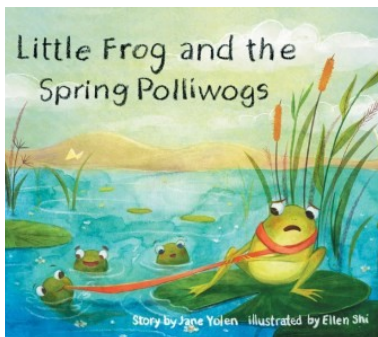

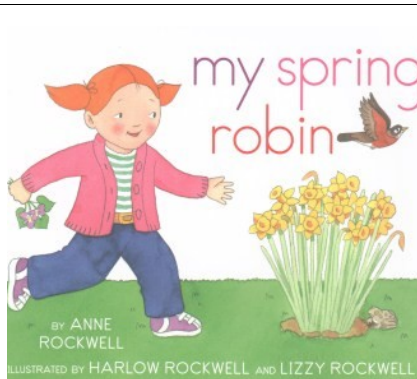
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A Little Book About Spring

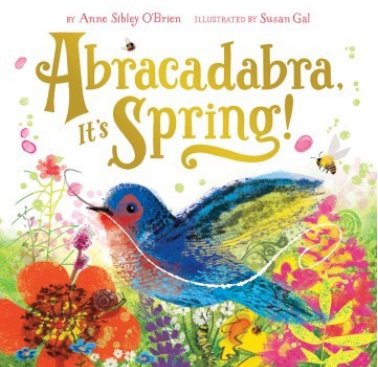
My Spring Robin

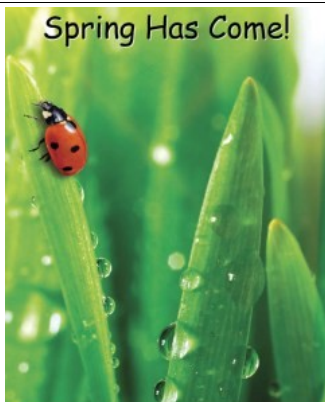

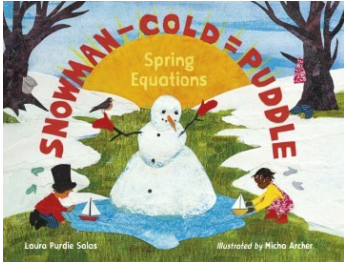

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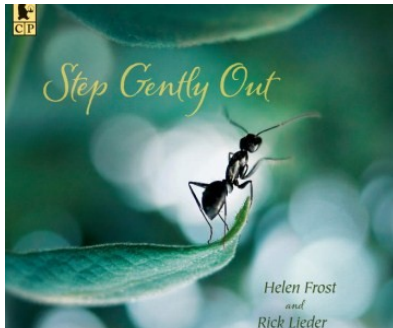
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Snowman— Cold = Puddle

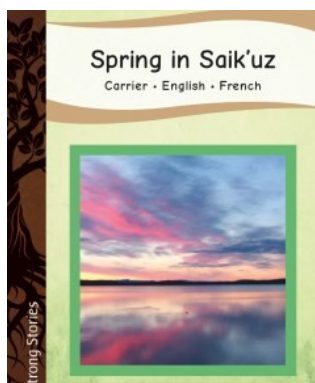


Patterns in Spring

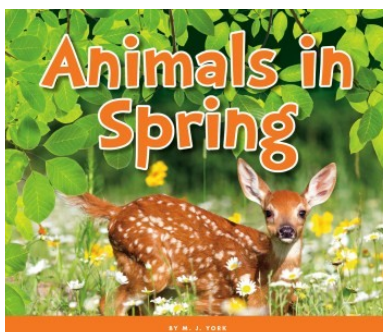


Spring in Saik'uz

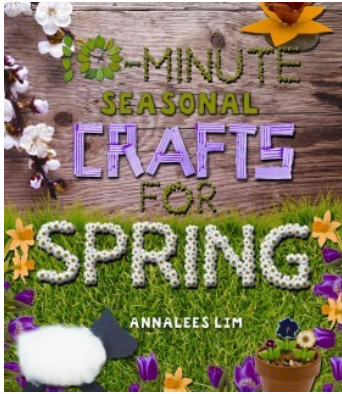

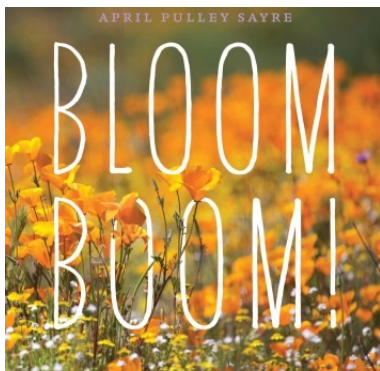
