Writing Trait: Ideas

Learning Intention: generating ideas about the importance of school

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Before Reading

Invite students to carefully examine the front and back cover images. Share the title of this book and ask for predictions.

Who might the children be?

Where might they be going?

Why might they be on a boat?

Predict what this book might be about.

During Reading

While reading this book to children, pause to offer time to carefully examine the details within the illustrations. Discuss what's happening and how it is similar or different from where we live.

After Reading

Explain that many children in the world desperately want to be able to go to school. Is it easy for them? What did we learn in this book that described how it was sometimes hard to get to school?

These children must really appreciate school. I wonder what they like most about school that makes them willing to travel long distances and in difficult conditions?


If you weren't in school, what would you miss most? Brainstorm or co-create some ideas that explain what you like most about school.
