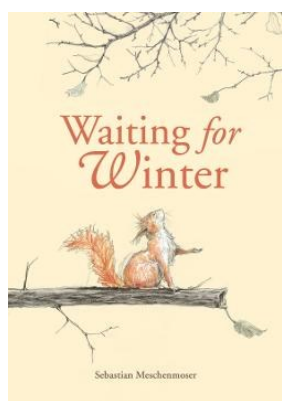

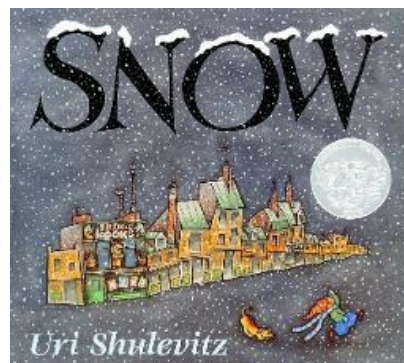

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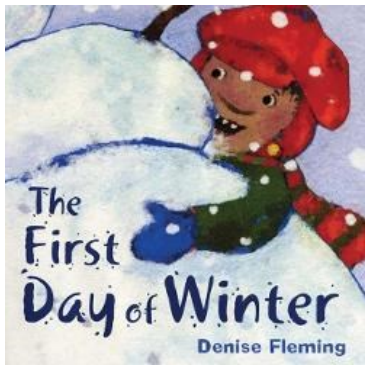
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Over and Under the Snow

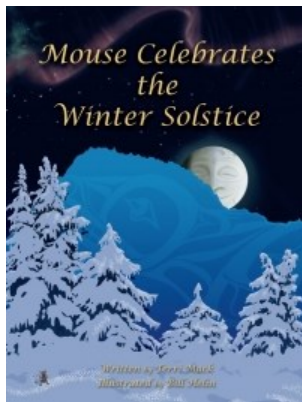

Snack Snooze Skedaddle: How Animals Get Ready For Winter

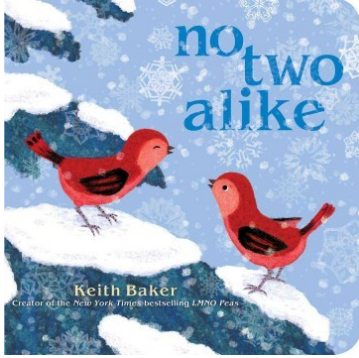

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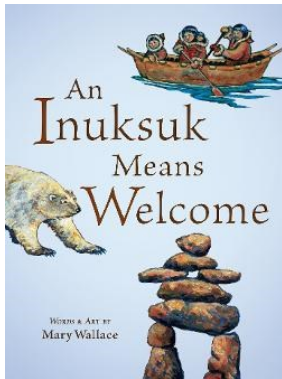
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Wonderful Winter

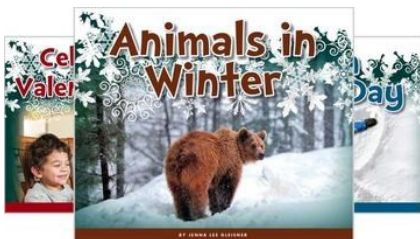

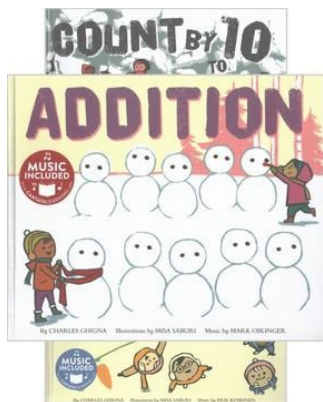
