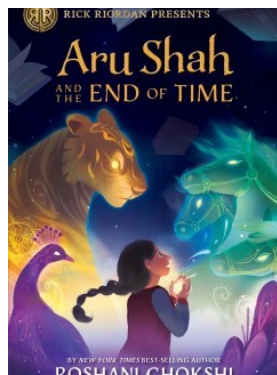


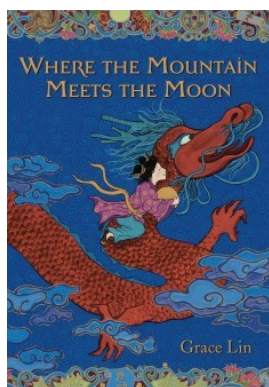

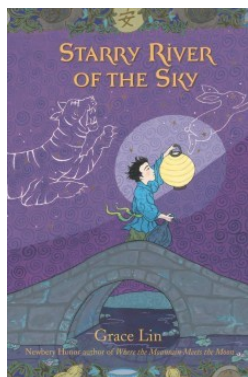
Aru Shah and the End of Time (Pandava, Book 1)

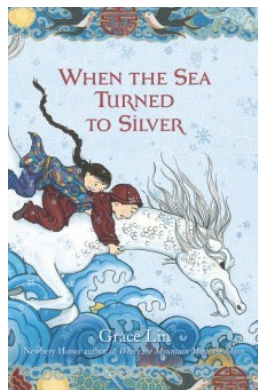
Where the Mountain Meets the Moon

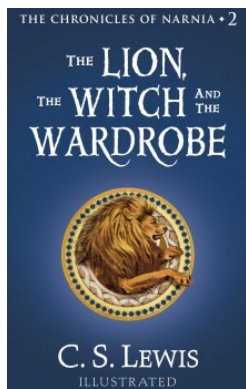
Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone (Harry Potter, Bk. 1)
