




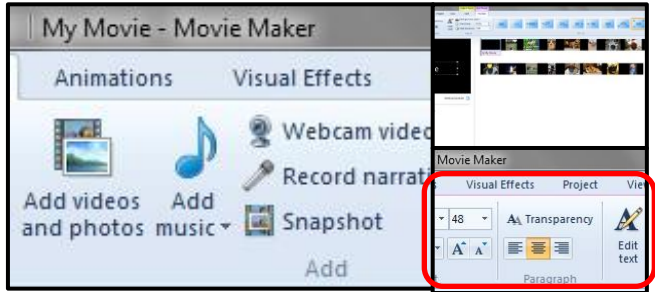
# Windows Movie Maker Instructions

Movie Maker comes with Windows 10. It is on all the staff as well as student computers.

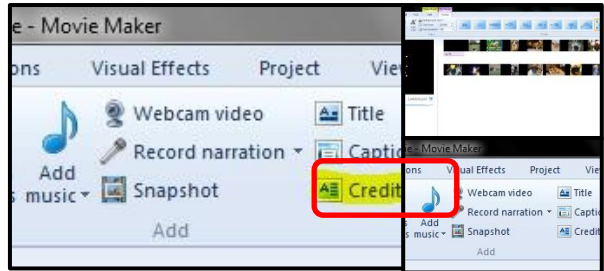
<p>1</p>	<p>Tap Windows Key on keyboard. Type in "Movie Maker". Double click on the link from the list.</p>	 <p>A screenshot of the Windows search interface. <p>3</p>	<p><b>Add Photos and Videos</b> Click on "Add videos and photos" button on the top left of the program to add videos or pictures. Navigate to the pictures or video clips you'd like to add. These will most likely be under your "Pictures" or "Videos" folders. To quickly select "All" in the folder, press "ctrl" + "A" to select all and then click on "Open" in the bottom right. **4** **Add Title**  
Click on the "Title" button. Movie Maker will automatically create a title page for your movie called "My Movie". Use the formatting options in the window that opens up when the title is selected. You can change the font, size, transparency, justification and transition effects.

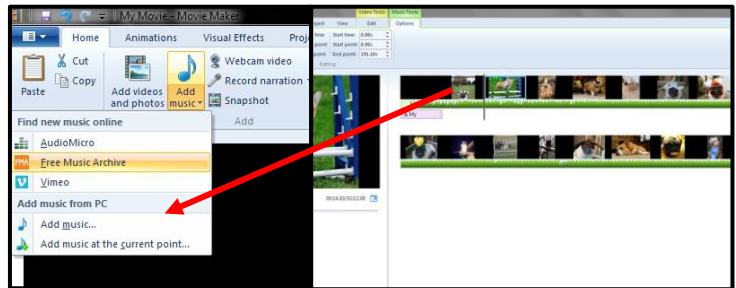
*To continue editing, click on the "Home tab" which will exit out of the text editing window.*



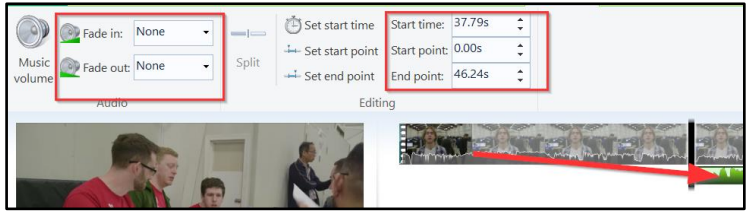
**5** **Add Credits**  
Click on the "Add Credits" button. Movie Maker will automatically add a Credits screen to the very end of your movie. Just like with the Title screen, you will be able to add your name to the Credits screen. The "Format" taskbar from before allows you to change the font and also add different transition effects to the credits slide.



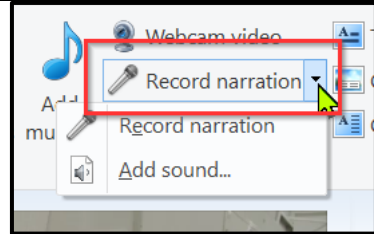
**6** **Add Music**  
Click on the "Add music" button and click on the "Add music from PC". (*The online music files no longer work*).  
Navigate to an audio file saved on your computer. You can download music from one of the free copyright free websites.  
Once you've uploaded a music file to your project, you'll see that it shows up in green in the overview window on the right side of the Movie Maker program.



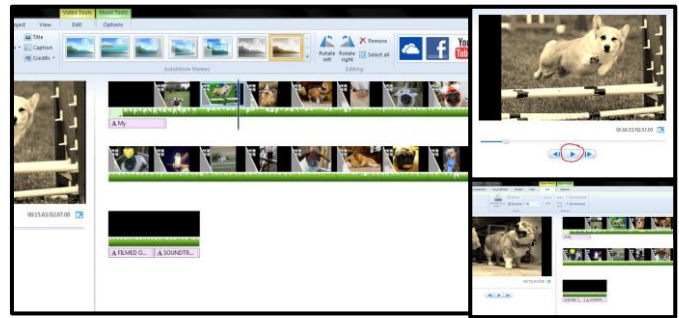
**7** **Edit Music**  
Double clicking on the green audio track, will open up editing options. Volume level, fades and start and stop points.



**8** **Adding Voice Over**  
To record a narration, click on the "Record Narration -> Record narration" button.



**9** **AutoMovie Themes**  
By selecting one of these AutoMovie Themes, Windows Movie Maker will automatically add in transitions for all of your pictures/videos, while still keeping your music and title/credit screens. To preview it, press the Play icon at the bottom of the screen.  
  
To increase or decrease the duration of the photos, select the individual picture on the overview and then change the "Duration" within the Edit toolbar on the top of the screen.



**11** **Export Movie to Local Device**  
The video can be exported to the local device and shared from there. Click on "Save Movie -> For computer".
