The Importance of Paying Attention to the World Around Us

OBJECTIVE

Students will understand the importance of balancing screen time with real-world experiences and the potential impacts of excessive screen use.

ACTIVATE

- Discussion: Start with a question: "What do you like to do on your smartphone or tablet?"
- **Storytime:** Read a short story about the importance of engaging with the world around us. Some options are:
 - a. "Unplugged" by Steve Antony
 - b. "When Charlie McButton Lost Power" by Suzanne Collins
 - c. "Dot" by Randi Zuckerberg
 - d. "Goodnight iPad" by Ann Droyd
 - e. "The Fabulous Friend Machine" by Nick Bland

APPLY

Video:

 Briefly explain the video "Like and Follow," emphasizing the story of a little boy who is always looking at his smartphone and misses the beauty around him.

Like and Follow

- Prior to watching the video, introduce the video prompts to be discussed after the video.
 - 1. What are some fun things you can do without a screen?"
 - 2. "How do you feel when you play outside or spend time with friends?"
- Explore these questions with the students as a large group after watching the video.

Art Activity:

- Using the template provided, have the students draw a picture of their favorite activity that doesn't involve a screen.
- Encourage them to share their drawings and explain why they enjoy these activities.

CONCLUSION

- Recap: Summarize the lesson by highlighting the importance of balancing screen time and real-world experiences.
- **Take-Home Message:** Encourage students to spend more time exploring the world around them and to be mindful of their screen use.

EXTENSION ACTIVITIES:

- **1. Home Assignment:** Ask students to watch the video "Like and Follow" with their parents and discuss what they learned in class.
