Because of this, Isabella has always felt pulled between two worlds. And now that her parents are divorced, it seems their fights are even worse, and they're always about HER. Isabella feels completely stuck in the middle, split and divided between them more than ever. And she is beginning to realize that being split between Mom and Dad involves more than switching houses, switching nicknames, switching backpacks: it's also about switching identities. Make sure the tab in the upper right-hand corner is set to “Public.” Then scroll down the lists that appear looking for the ones that start with “LRC.” Once you pull up the titles in a list you can click on them and book them directly from that screen.

Tips for Booking LRC Novel Sets

Below are the most often asked questions about booking LRC novels for lit circles as well as for whole class novel studies.

How do I search for a novel title when I know the title that I am looking for?

Log into your school library and click on **Catalog**. Ensure the checkmark is beside the LRC and the other search fields are set to the defaults. In the “Find” bar type in your title and press Enter:

How do I search to see what novels are available for my grade when I don't have a specific title in mind?

Log into your school library and click on **Catalog**. On the left-hand side of the screen click on **Resource Lists** then ensure that the **Public** tab is selected in the upper right-hand side of the screen. The LRC has made the following “Resource Lists” to group novels for one-stop browsing. Click on the list that is the best fit for what you are looking for. When you see a title that interests you, click on it.

How do I know how many copies of a novel there are?

When you search for a novel by title two records for it will display. One is for a box of 10, and the other is for single copies. Here is an example for the novel Slacker:

If I want to book a total of 30 novels (3 boxes of 10), how do I do this?

You first need to make sure that 3 boxes of 10 are available. Below is an example of the records for “The Next Great Paulie Fink”:

On the screen that appears, be sure to fill in 3 for the number of copies. When picking your starting date, be sure to select the day that your school receives LRC deliveries. The note under the calendar states this. Also skip ahead in the calendar to see that the novel is available for the length of time that you need it. The loan period for novels is 6 weeks. If you double click on your start date in the calendar, and there are 6 available weeks from that date, the system will fill in your end date for you.

If you see the novel title listed there, it has been booked for you. "**Pending**" indicates that the LRC Circulation staff has yet to approve the booking. This will be done when the novels are pulled from the shelves for delivery.

Which LRC Novels have ARC-BC copies?

All LRC novel titles were sent to ARC-BC for digital copies in three versions. If you find that a novel title does not have an ARC-BC version then ask your LST to request one. If a "rush" job is requested then ARC-BC will try and get it done as soon as possible.

Which LRC Novels have professionally narrated digital audio books?

Whenever a digital audio book is available to purchase in an “own forever” format, it is purchased. The audio books are either purchased from Follett, our library software company” or from Overdrive, which hosts its content on the SORA platform. Most of the ebooks and audiobooks purchased from Follett in the past were moved to the Overdrive SORA platform in the summer of 2020 because it is such so user-friendly and attractive. A few Follett ebooks and audiobooks couldn’t be transferred to the SORA platform due to copyright. These titles can only be found by doing a library Catalog search for the title.

To make it easier for teachers to see in one spot what LRC novel titles have digital audio books, a Resource List was made. When you click on this list it will show the titles that have audiobooks, but to sign them out you must do a library **Catalog** search. Note that the ebooks and audio books are typically one copy one user at a time. If you need more than one copy at a time, discuss this with your Teacher-Librarian.

Notes From the Adrienne Gear Online Pajama Pro-d Sessions

Whole Class Novel Study Workshop

How Adrienne plans her year:

Term One: She teaches Reading Power (RP) strategies using picture books so students develop a language to understand and share their thinking.

Term Two: She does a whole class novel study through reading aloud a novel and modelling the Reading Power (RP) strategies.

Term Three: Students engage in Lit Circle books according to reading ability, similar activities but independence varies, weekly check-ins.

She highlights the difference between **“Book Reading”** (Decoding and Fluency) and **“Brain Reading”** (Comprehension, Thinking, Metacognition: Making Predictions, Literal Re-tell, Making Connections, Asking Questions, Visualizing, Inferring, Transformed Thinking.)

Reading Powers:

- Connect
- Question
- Visualize
- Infer
- Transform
- Predict
- Summarize

Anne Proulx: “The words on the page are only half the story...the rest is what you bring to the party.”

Create a common language around what thinking sounds like: “I’m thinking...”, “I’m wondering...”, “I’m noticing...”, “I’m picturing...”, “It reminds me of...”, “I’m figuring out...”, “I just learned...”

When Adrienne is reading aloud she likes to put post-it notes in the books where she stops and shares her thinking, i.e., “This reminds me of...”

“Turn and Talk” is a powerful strategy Adrienne uses to get students to share their thinking.

Adrienne’s tip for students whose summaries are longer than the story? Use her **“Somebody...Wanted...But...So...Then...”** strategy. A template is in her book. She also uses a similar template for students to map out simple stories they are writing.

The “**Diamante**” activity is helpful to do after reading a novel aloud (format: noun, adjective, adjective, verb, verb, verb, etc.) (See template.)

Connect M.I.T.s (Most Important Points)

Not all connections help you understand the story better. They need to be connected to the heart of the story, feelings and experiences of the character. “Bring It Back To the Book!” (BIBB) Use your “brain pockets” to help find connections.

Visualize M.I.T.s

It is a “thinking picture” you see in your brain and you need to train the brain to visualize. Use your brain pockets, visualizing comes from all three parts. Use all your senses to visualize. She likes to practice with “Imagine a Day” by Sarah Thomson. She reads the whole book then students draw an imagine for one page of their choice. Then she shows them the pages. See the template for “Visualize...Draw...Describe.”

Question M.I.T.s

Good readers ask questions before, during and after they read. There are quick questions to help with clarifying facts and deep-thinking questions that help stretch our thinking. Makes sure questions are connected to the main idea of the story. See the template for “What Are You Wondering?”

Infer M.I.T.s

Good writers leave spaces for our thinking and good readers fill in what is missing. That is inferring. Use brain pockets to do this. “Maybe...”, or “I think...” are words/phrases to trigger inferring. Best places to infer are character traits, emotions, and themes. Showing students images and asking them what they are inferring is a good starting point. “Less ink means more think.” (Adrienne). See the template for “O.W.I.” A “prediction” is a level one inference (you know the answer by the end of the book so no further thinking. An “inference” is level two as it is never verified but adds meaning and the thinking keeps going.

Transform M.I.T.s

Transforming is when your thinking gets stretched. A thought in your head gets “re-arranged” because of something you read. A transformed thought doesn’t erase or replace a thought, just changes how it looks. Learning is “re-telling” and understanding is “re-thinking.” See the template “First thoughts about...(connection, visual image, feeling)” and the “One Word Activity...” template. For the latter strategy, before the book is shown to the students, they see one word written in the middle of a page that is connected to the novel that will be read. For example, the word “chocolate.” Students write thoughts about the word radiating out from the centre like a web. After reading the story the students use a different colour to show the stretching of their thinking (transforming) about the word (theme.) For “chocolate”, the students thought about the treat, but in reality the novel was about deeper themes like slavery.

Purpose of Whole Class Novel Study:

Model interactive brain reading, provide explicit instruction of the Reading Powers, show students how thinking enhances reading pleasure, and give students the tools they need to participate in thoughtful book discussions.

Benefits of a Read Aloud Novel:

All students can focus on “brain reading” as the reading level of the text does not come into play and evens the playing field, a more challenging reading level can be chosen, provides students with an opportunity to develop their listening comprehension skills, provides opportunities to model the teacher’s thinking (put post it notes in the book to highlight different Reading Powers and thinking) and enables a gradual release of responsibility.

While Reading Aloud Share:

Personal connections, descriptive/visual passages, questions and wonderings you have, “maybe’s”, i.e., inferences, predictions, themes and messages you think the author might be implying. Post-its are helpful to remember these powerful parts.

Activity before reading: “Before You Read!” (See template.)

Activity while reading “What Strategy Would You Use?” (See template.)

Wrap Up Activities such as “Transforming My Thinking”, “What? So What? Now What?” (See templates.)

Introducing the Study:

Explain the novel study and it will involve both written and oral participation.

Have piles of the books on display but do not pass out. Maybe cover them a few days ahead of this lesson to create interest.

Divide class into their groups. Invite them to choose a name for their book club.

Each group does the “One Word Activity.” (See template.)

Also, “Before You Read!” template.

Remind students of the Reading Power Tips:

BIBB: Bring It Back to the Book

Somebody Wanted But So Then

Deep thinking Connections

Deep thinking Questions

Maybe’s

Visualizing what sticks

Once a week groups do the “**Weekly Thinking Page.**” (See template.)

Remind them how to summarize with the “Somebody Wanted But So Then” template.

Students share their thinking in their groups. She circulates and listens in. See the “Lit Circle Discussion Record” template.

When the novel is finished, give students back their “**One Word Activity**” sheet. They add their new thinking to it in a different colour of pen. In this way they can see how their thinking has been transformed.
