










Screen Casting with Windows Game Controls

Introduction:

Any windows computer has game controls which can be used to record your screen while in games.

Steps:		
1	Open the game that you would like to record (ex. Minecraft) Go to the place that you would like the recording to start.	
2	If your game has sound, you may wish to turn off the game sound so your voice can be heard. In Minecraft: a. Press Escape (Esc) and click on Settings b. Scroll down on the left to Audio c. Turn off Main Sound	
3	When you are ready press  + G	
4	You may need to press the Camera icon to open the screen capture menu.	
5	Press the record button and begin your screencast. Make sure that you speak clearly.	
6	You will notice a timer appears on your screen. It doesn't show up in the video but it can help you make sure that you stop recording in the right amount of time (ex. 3 minutes). Also make sure that the microphone is on – if it is crossed off, click on it to open it.	
7	When you are finished your recording, click on the white square in the blue circle to end the recording.	
8	Your recording is saved in your Videos file on your computer.	

9	To find your video, open File Explorer .	
10	<p>Click on This PC.</p> <p>Click on Videos.</p>	
11	Your video will be in a folder in the video folder called Captures .	



Tip...

If you need to edit your video you will have to open it in another program to work on it. Clipchamp is a free video editing tool you are welcome to use. To find it, open your Office 365 account and click to look at all the apps. You will find it there:
