INTRODUCE UDL

IMPLEMENT AN LMS

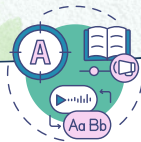
Platforms like Teams or Brightspace can increase student engagement and provide a central hub for resources and communication.



03.

ACCESS TO ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY

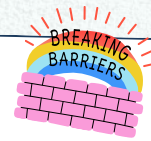
Tools such as speech-to-text software, text-to-speech, predictive text, PDF interaction, closed captioning, and alternative input devices can help students.



04.

IDENTIFY BARRIERS

Identify common barriers in the classroom as well as student specific barriers to help support them in their learning.



05.

STUDENT CHOICE & VOICE

Give students a voice in their learning and provide choices in how they demonstrate their understanding. This includes flexible learning environments.



06.

ONGOING ASSESSMENT & FEEDBACK

Implement regular assessments and feedback mechanisms to monitor student progress and make necessary adjustments. Make them timely and meaningful.



07.

DIGITAL TEXTBOOKS & RESOURCES

Provide digital versions of textbooks and other learning materials so it's easier to adapt content to meet diverse needs.



08.

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING

Provide access to information on inclusive education (UDL) to provide guidance and support for teachers and staff.



09.

COLLABORATION

Collaborate for the planning and sharing of ideas, as well as identifying common barriers within specific locations and to ensure consistency in delivering the resources.



10.

COMMUNITY SUPPORT

Engage parents for support, reach out to school support in the form of EAs or LSTs or district support for human resources as well as learning resource tools.
