Core Word Focus: MORE & AGAIN

Our next core word are actually two buttons that complement each other quite well; **more** and **again**. These words are social words that have the power of continuing something positive when communicated to another person. When someone has the word **again** in their repertoire they are initiating, advocating, and stewarding their experience. **Again** is often one of the first words that lets kids experience the huge power of communication. We use the word **more** to express a desire for a little extra of something. It can be used to request the continuation of an activity or to get additional quantities of something.

Be mindful of not holding back the fun you would usually share together just so they have the motivation to use the word. Yes, providing learning and practice opportunities is very important, but so is maintaining their trust in you as a learning ally. It is much better to support their communication of **again** and **more** with another communication partner (like a kid!).

Examples:

More cookies, please

Let's read **more** of this book

Is there **more** to do?

I want **more** water

Do you have **more** glue?

Let's play it **again**

Go **again**!

Not **again**!!

Want to do it **again**?

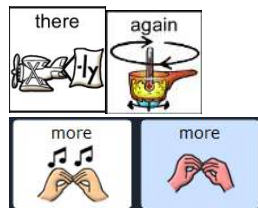

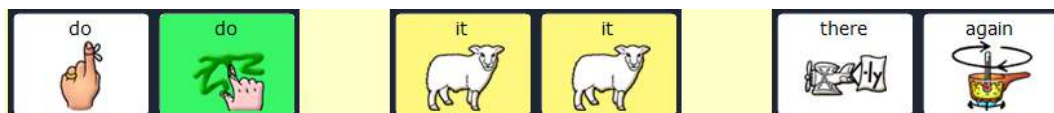

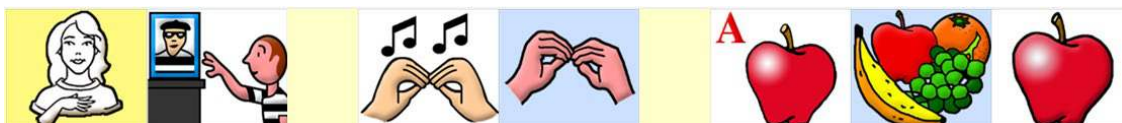
