

Historical Newspapers is a rich source of research tips and strategies applicable to any kind of research or inquiry. This K-12 resource allows staff and students to access digital archives of historic British Columbia newspaper content, dating back to the 1880s.

SEARCH OPTIONS

Use the **Search** feature to get results from different databases. You can also **refine your search** results by keyword or change the sort to "oldest" or "most recent" to refine your search.

Search terms are **highlighted** in the digital version of the newspaper, and you can download the PDF version free of mark ups.

RESEARCH SUPPORT

Besides historical newspapers, locate **research tips** in the form of short video clips, useful for starting any kind of research project.

Also accessible are several other databases, providing access to **scholarly articles**, statistical records, and primary and secondary sources.

DYNAMIC CONTENT

The home page features different **highlighted content** each time the page is opened. This encourages students to investigate research and inquiry tips.

Research and inquiry support includes short videos covering topics such as *Asking Good Questions* and *How to Cite an Article*.

CLASSROOM ACTIVITIES

Search old newspapers for **contemporary coverage** of historical events.

Learn about **advertising or graphic design** methods or examine the use of language.

Reveal **trends over time** and compare modern newspapers to historical ones.
