



# *Jewelry Making 10*



## Introduction

Jewelry 10 –is course that falls under the Applied Skills, Design and Technologies umbrella of BC’s New Curriculum.

What? Jewelry making in school? Making jewelry can be fun. It can be a profession, but it can also be an enjoyable hobby. It can also help you learn useful skills. In this class you will learn about:

- Jewelry design and construction
- Tools and equipment
- Safe workshop practices
- Cold and hot metal working procedures
- Traditional and modern jewelry making techniques

## Projects

There will be several set projects in this class, as well as the opportunity to explore your own creativity. A few of the projects will be:

- Useful Skill Builder – jewelry ‘bench pin’
- Metal Casting – Pewter
- Rings – Band, Wire, Wood
- Laser – Coated Aluminum, Acrylic, Copper Etch, Jewelry Box
- Saw Projects – Pendants
- Recycled/Reclaimed – Pop Art

More projects may be introduced if time permits.
